

This does not count the thousands of dollars poured out by the community through social media sites, community fundraisers, and private donations. On May 12th, over 100 student and staff volun-

teers were on hand to wash an endless line of cars that waited for hours, even as it began to rain ("God's rinse cycle," according to East teacher Nicole Miller). In addition to the East student, staff and teams present, students from other Glenbards pitched in, and even students from Willowbrook High School rolled up their sleeves to help. Willowbrook High School sent a large buffet of treats to the staff of Glenbard East to show their love and support. Red ribbons, provided by Phillips Flowers were tied to most trees in the community. 



Rebel Seoul, by Axie Oh, follows eighteen years old ex-gang member, Lee Jaewon, in Neo Seoul, where status comes from success in combat.

Jaewon is a talented pilot who was abandoned in the slums of Old Seoul, by his rebel father. Jaewon only wants to escape his last and prove himself loyal to the Neo State.

When Jaewon is recruited into the most lucrative weapons development division in Neo Seoul, he is eager to prove himself. But the mission becomes more and more complicated when he meets Tera, a test subject in the government's super soldier project.

Jaewon becomes a spy on Tera, and reports on her, but also becomes her partner, earning her reluctant respect. But as respect turns into love, Jaewon must decide where his loyalty lies- as a soldier of the Neo State, or a rebel of the people.


Now, the once normal (ish) life if Anya is turned upside down as she is thrown into the spotlight, at school, in the news, and most importantly, within her mafia family.
