Course Descriptions:

English Learners - Language Skills EL - REMOTE ONLY (EN1141/2) -

This course is appropriate for non-English speaking students. An intense immersion in English language and American culture will prepare students for EL 2 and other appropriate academic classes. Students will improve their English language proficiency in the language domains of reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

English Learners - U.S. History EL - REMOTE ONLY (SS3041/2) - This two-semester EL Social Studies course for **EL 3 and EL Bridge** students is designed to meet two objectives: to improve each student's English language ability and to learn about United States history. Students explore significant events from the Colonial Period through the 20th Century and will be encouraged to think critically about the events and people that have come to define the United States. Students also practice reading, writing, speaking, and listening in English. Successful completion of U.S. History provides students with the skills and background knowledge needed in U.S. Government and Politics EL.
